My dear Ginder:

Many thanks for your suggestion that I write a book called "The Scientist Looks at One World". I am afraid that I would have to reword the title to ". . . The World" rather than ". . . One World" because I find it anything but united in the sense you mean.

The American Journal of Hygiene is primarily a medium for papers of epidemiological interest and I thought that the one on Korea belonged there despite the considerable proportion of clinical material which it contained. I did not feel that it belonged in the J.A.M.A. and I thought that no other clinical journal would reach the epidemiologists for whom the paper would probably have the greatest interest. I have recently sent you some reprints and among them, the only one so far published on the work on dengue. The writing up of the dengue work is still one of my projects for the future. In this respect I was wondering whether the Jim Hagans you mentioned is the same one who served as a volunteer for our dengue vaccine work in 1945. I spoke to Dr. Ferris about you. He was impressed by the high praise that I showered upon you. The letters of recommendation to Drs. Wintrobe, Bishop and Watson will be in the mail today.
