
The Senate yesterday passed the health appropriations bill providing \$98,922,000 for the Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases for Fiscal Year 1968. This is an increase of \$4,500,000 over the figure voted by the House of Representatives and \$11,502,000 more than FY 1967.

The enclosed Report explains how the Senate intends the new funds to be used.

The bill now goes back to the House of Representatives, where the House will no doubt insist on its own figures. That will mean the appointment of conferees and a series of meetings to work out a compromise of the two versions of the bill. When agreement is reached and the conference report adopted, the bill will go to the White House to be enacted into law. I'll let you know when that happens.

I have asked the committee to send you a copy of the hearings direct from the Capitol. It should reach you in a few days and it will bear the frank of the chairman of the full committee, Senator Carl Hayden.
