

For the sake of brevity, we are deleting a few passages from the discussion which appear redundant, or which do not seem particularly pertinent to the decisions the Medical Advisory Committee has to make. In the parts of the discussion retained, there may be some of your briefer questions and remarks which are not included in the material sent to you for revision.

It will be a great favor if you will return the revised text at your earliest convenience, — within two weeks if possible. The complete proceedings should be ready for mimeographing by February 5th. A copy will be sent to you when it is ready for distribution.
