Dear Dr. Boyd:

I deeply regret having delayed so long returning the transcript of the Conference on Gamma Globulin. It came during a period when I had practically no time at all to spare away from the laboratory, and the large number of pages frankly scared me.

With regard to the specific suggestions contained in your letter of March 9, I regret that I cannot agree with the substitution you suggest in (1). I think the observations quoted there are very pertinent to the whole discussion, and it would seem to me deserve the space they occupy. With regard to pages 147 to 149, I doubt very much that any space would be saved if the discussion were boiled down to one speech on each side. As it stands now, it is a logical exchange of ideas. I have cut out as much stuff as seemed feasible.
