Dear Mr. Levi,

Many thanks for your letter of February 17 which arrived during my absence from Charleston. I well remember the time about two years ago when we were both guests at the home of our mutual friend, Aboud Janho. His assassination was a great shock to us. I appreciated your asking me to do everything I possibly can to help with the education of Janho's children in the United States.

His son, Rajae, has long been adopted by Heloisa and myself as a nephew. He lives across a lake from us in a house that Janho bought last year. Rajae is very hard-working but in view of the great competition, has been unsuccessful thus far in being admitted as a regular student to the College of Medicine of the Medical University of South Carolina here in Charleston. However, he was given an opportunity to enroll as a special student and to take many of the courses that the medical students are taking. The Dean of the school is most helpful and Rajae is working so hard and doing so well in his studies that there is good hope that eventually he will be transferred to the Medical College as a regular student.

In the meantime, the President of the College of Charleston has been most helpful with the arrangements for Janho's two other children, Grace and Issa, when they come to Charleston later on this year. Grace, who will be graduating from high school in Ramallah, will be able to study at the College of Charleston and young Issa will be able to attend a private school.
