Thanks you for you letter of September 6. I read you paper and found it excellent. From our part there are not objections for you to reproduce our graph appeared in the March issue of our Bulletin, warrant you permission to do it.

I am enclosing herewith the June Bulletin in which you can see the status of measles in our Hospital up to May (by months); enclosing also a graph not published yet made out with the number of cases per week up to the 35th weeks. As you can see the effect of the vaccination is impressive. The number of cases in the capital seen by private physician are still nil. The report of cases from hospital in the interior of the country seem also nil or very low, however as you know, that information it's not under our control.
