Dear Doctor Bauer:

The purpose of this note is to remind you that if you should ever have the opportunity to recalibrate the 308.6 mu membrane (No.493) I would be very much interested in the result.

Filtration through this membrane was no more rapid and perhaps even slower than through the 101.1 mu membrane. Negative results were obtained in the people inoculated with the filtrate obtained from it. The limiting filtration end-points were obtained with the 101.1 mu membrane--No.481, through which the passage of virus was questionable, and the 75.5 membrane--No.376, through which no virus passed. Since both of them are old membranes, I would also be very much interested to know their present A.P.D. should you have the opportunity to recalibrate them in the near future.
